
don't you think?

## In Defense of the Las Vegas Show -- by Laune Jensen.

In all fairness, I felt I should write in rebuttal to Gale's article about "Las Vegas Purgatory" that was in the last Rag.

Having put on live shows for the past year or so, I am very aware of all the effort that goes into the organizing and logistics of a live model exhibition. All too often it is easy for people to complain about the negative aspects of your show, forgetting the enjoyable or well run parts. Therefore, I will give my own view as to the positive things about the Las Vegas Breyer Show.

First, Hiked the hotel and the location. True, it was a LONG walk to the hall, but the food was easily available and as good as any fast food is, and it was nice to have the room to retreat to or go back to for something I'd forgotten. Abandoning the car in the parking lot after the long drive was a welcome relief. Packing and unpacking the car each day was avoided (and was something I appreciated not having to do)!

The hall itself was wonderful! Large and well set-up, plenty of room for your horses, tack, sale models, paperwork-just great! The tablecloths were a nice touch, and the lighting was fairly good. The PA system could have been louder, but it was O.K., and far better than at some shows where the equivalent of a midway barker screamed at the exhibitors (in a voice none to pleasant) whenever a class was called up or to be cleared away. The music was irritating, but not bad enough to keep me from attending again.

I judged some classes on Saturday, and I felt I did a good job, even though, after a class. I was corrected by an exhibitor that was more familiar with roping equipment than I was. Although it was embarrassing to me, Hearned something and I thought it was nice that the shower didn't make a scene when I placed the class. Keep in mind that most judges are volunteers who rarely even get lunch, let alone their room paid for! I have ridden dressage, saddleseat, hunters, jumpers, westren, and gymkana, and I'm very familiar with the ASHA rulebook but I've never roped and roping is not covered in the ASHA rulebook so I did the best I could. Please, showers, not everyone can know everything about evrerything (although I know some people who claim they do...) and on an average day, an average person will make an average number of honest mistakes. If this hobby had a standardized, universally accepted rulebook, you'd see better judging. Since this isn't the case, each judge must adapt real horse rules to the models and do the best he or she is capable of. I know I sometimes find myself getting irritated at judges who don't know a lot about harnesses or h/j, and it's hard for me to out them some slack. But we've all got to support our judges and showholders or we will find ourselves without volunteers! No showholders, no judges, no shows! Think about it.

Lagree that there were not-so-good things about the Vegas show. But on the average, I feel the organizers did a good job and should be encouraged to continue in their efforts.

(Kay here - this looks like a good time to point out something - Laurie was a LAST-MINUTE VOLUNTEER JUDGE! She was talked into judging on the day of the show, and had NOTHING to do with the show committee, and how the show was run, either before or after the competition. She recently received a rather cruel letter from someone accusing her of mistakes made by the show committee in getting results out, etc., and we wanted to clear up any misunderstandings here and now.







Now isn't that simple? If your dad owns a computor, you can ask him for those neat computor labels to type all your model's information on, address return labels are nice for the lower right hand corner, remember this; the more weight you put on the back of the pic the more postage you will have to pay to send these!!

OK! Now all you pix are labeled, what next, you ask? Look elsewhere in this FANTASTIC magazine and find a photo show (there's one coming up on Feb. 27), get out two Large envelopes, put my name on the front of one with your name in the top left corner. In the bottom left corner put MODEL RAG PHOTO SHOW. (This way, when I get your envelope I'll know what its for). Now get out the other large envelope and put your name on the front and mine in the left-hand corner. I also have return address labels I can use for this envelope. Set those aside. Take out your pix. Look at the classlist I have typed. Is your model a stallion? An Original Finish (O.F.) current? A Traditional? How about an Appaloosa? Then WITH A PENCIL mark on the scotch tape so these numbers look like this:

Of course, the numbers will be different if its a different model. Next, when you are all done, put your photos in a Baggie, put that in the envelope, along with the envelope for return of your pix, \$2.00 for "entry fees" and take this down to the post office to get weighed. Remember that BOTH envelopes need to be weighed. Seal the envelope and mail it!! One more thing, how about a nice little note? And Good luck!!

### Showing Dressage with your Model Horse... by L.J. Jensen

In the real horse world, dressage is a very involved mental and physical exercise for the rider and the horse. Training is done slowly with any new movements added as the horse understands and reponds correctly to the signals given by the seat, hands, legs, and weight of the rider.

Obviously, dressage cannot be "performed" by a model horse, but it helps to know what most judges are looking for in a stationary model that is positioned and tacked up to look las though he is executing a dressage test correctly.

I do not intend to dig deeply into the science and theory behind real horse dressage in this brief article. First, I am not an authority; I have ridden many Training Level tests and have taken lessons for several years, but I am not an expert. I do know what the judge is looking for, though. (Even if I can't make a horse do it....Oh well!)

Let's start with the requirements on each level.

Desirable characteristics judges look for in a dressage horse at any level: suppleness, relaxation, free forward movement, correct gaits, good attitude, cadence, proper carriage and impulsion.

The arena:




Fig. 1. A small dressage arena The arena fence can be poles on ground or LOW rail or fence.




Fig. 2. Standard Dressage Arena

(Note: markers are used for letters on the rail only, not down the center line.)

When a test is ridden, different gaits and transitions occur (and are scored by the judge) at and between the letters on the arena. What is performed depends on the level and the test. At any level, the horse must be prepared to go calmly at all gaits and perform all maneuvers without getting irritated or excited.

In model horses, remember that the horse should look relaxed, attentive, on the bit, and be correctly performing the movement. Horses at the halt should be as square as possible, with head relaxed and on the bit. Horses in other positions should be on the bit and look as if they are moving freely and with impulsion.

Model Horse dressage faults:

Head too high and not on bit

Incorrect gait (cross-firing or too collected or too extended)

No impulsion (Horse is carrying all it's weight on the front legs, with no power coming from the rear legs)

incorrect tack and appointments for level

Sloppy grooming and tack

Incorrect letters on arena or letters in improper sequence

Incorrect bend (horse is counterflexed away from rail unless performing a half-pass or similar movement)

Behind the bit (head and neck over-flexed)

Tilring head (face not held vertically)

General disobedience (rearing, bucking, etc.)

Those I've given some idea of the requirements of dressage. Many good books are available on the subject. Try these:



This time around, I'm featuring the 6" Mustang family. These were made in 1960-61,

1962-65, and 1968-70.



B-731, Daisy (mare) stands 5-1/2" tall. She came in brown, reddish brown, pinto (the pinto being simply a white front leg and shoulder!), and rose grey. (note: I have a friend who has one in WHITE!!)

B-732, Butch (foal) stands 4 1/2" tal. He came in brown (looks buckskin), pinto ia left hind leg white past the hock), rose grey, white, and grey.

 $B\!-\!730$  , Commanche (stallion) stands 6  $1/2^{\prime\prime}$  tall. He came in brown, brownish red., buckskin, tan, and rose grey.

All three models were produced from 1960-61, 1962-65, and 1966-70. The adults originally sold for \$3.00, and the foal for \$2.00.

This family is the same one that Breyer now makes in Tenite. They (the Hayens!) are a

"hot item" for any avid collector!







#### TO ALL MODEL HORSE COLLECTORS & HORSE LOVERS:



Hartland Horse Models were first introduced to the world of Model Horse Collectors in 1947. Hartland Plastics made a wide selection of styles, many of which have become rare today. Because of the artists that Hartland used and their dedication in duplicating exact conformation and muscle structure, Hartland models are treasured by collectors & consumers today. Hartland models are hard competition to beat in any model show, because of their excellent detail.

When some of the molds were sold to the Strombecker Corp. of Chicago, many people believed all of the molds that were not sold were being stored somewhere. Because the molds were what the plastic industry called temporary molds, (molds only used till they were worn out) any

molds not good enough to sell were destroyed. However, it was a common practice to remake another mold, duplicating the same mold designs & then destroy the old mold. That is why there are some minor differences between what appears at first glance, to be identical horse models.

The Strombecker Corp., Durant Plastic Division, made Hartland Models from 1970 thru 1973. During that time, they tryed to duplicate many of the Hartland colors and models, so there are many look alike Hartlands out there. There are many ways to distinguish between a Durant and a true Hartland, but you need to know the models very well. Often times a hands-on examination is required, even by the experts. There was a book published by Gail Fitch called "Hartland Horses & Riders" that tells of the differences, history, and colors that the models were made in before Steven Manufacturing Co., (the current owners of the Hartland molds) started making them again. The book also contains over 100 color photos showing many of the models. She offers two versions: 1) Regular, with 26 photo pages (over 100 photos) in color for \$35.00, postpaid. 2) Modified, with 15 photo pages in color & the rest in black/white, for \$25.00, postpaid. Both have the same text, illustrated cover, spiral binding & a total of 70 pages. Please mention our name when you write to her at: 926 N. Cass St, 5, Milwaukee, WI 53202.

In 1983 Steven's re-introduced the 11" Regal Series. In February, 1984, they brought back the 9" Individual Series. For 1985, they had three new colors in the 11" Regal Series, one brand new mold in the same size, two new colors in the 9" series, and the farm yard animals display that Hartland used to make with the little red barn. Stevens Mfg. Co. had a terrible flood on October 4, 1986. The entire first floor of the plant was flooded, destroying many finished goods, corrugated, labels, etc. The loss was so great the decision was made to not make anymore of the Hartland models. They are just selling the remaining finished goods that were not in the flood. When they are gone, their colors will not be duplicated.

#### WHAT'S NEW WITH HARTLANDS NOW??!!

Hartland Collectables is happy to announce that we are the new manufacturers of Hartland Models! You will be very pleased with the improvements we have already started to make. We have a new dated Collectors Color Brochure available (one showing Steven models still available & one showing new TENITE models by us) for only \$1.00 & a large stamped envelope if not ordering with a model order. The color brochure states that #420 Arab Stallion is a Light Bay. However, the photo shows a much darker bay than our production color. #421 is really a beautiful Standard Chestnut color & not as dark as the photo. The #400Black Appaloosa really has smaller spots on his rump in more of a pattern & the spots on his face are only on his pink mottled nose.

The #401 Red Roan (10" Quarterhorse model) with the tack on him is #01 of a very special run of only 50 pieces. you can only order this model in this color with the saddle set & matching bridle. The model will be signed by "Hartland Collectables" with the date and model number on the belly. A leather tage (shown on brochure) with a stamped picture of the model will be attached to the leg of each model. His registration number & date will be written on the tag.

The saddle set consists of 1 leather embossed saddle with a back skirt, matching breast collar, saddlebags. The matching bridle has a sterling silver bit in the form of a heart with a silver disc attached at the top with an "H" engraved on it. The browband conchas also has an "H" engraved on it. 
