SPECIAL CLASSES

1. Barrel Race - horses must be shown turning a barrel. Proper tack. First place gets a Tinymite model. Fee, 10¢ per horse. Placing to first only.
2. Trail Class - must be shown over two obstacles. (2 pix) Awards same as Barrel; fee 10¢ per horse.

RULES

1. Best of Breed will be determined by how many points and classes a horse has won. To win best of show, a horse must be entered in both divisions one and two. The horse must win at least 2 firsts. The horse must be entered in at least 3 classes or more to win best of show.
2. DATE - July 12 (change of date possible - may be changed to the 20th or so).
3. Awards - non-commercial ribbons from 1st - 5th place, results to 10th. Commercial rosettes or ribbons to Best of Breed, Best of Show, Halter, and Pleasure Championships.
4. Entry fee - 10¢ per horse per class. Proper tack required in all classes.
5. Enclose plenty of return postage.






FACTS ON PINTOS

1. A pinto is any horse that is spotted of any breed except appaloosas.
2. A paint is a horse bred for it's color, and can be registered either as a Tobiano, Overo, or Medicino Hat.
3. A Tobiano has large, regular, distinct spots, four white legs, and basically a dark head, mane & tail color of hair growing from spot.
4. An overo has an irregular, spottishly (hmm), pattern with dark legs, and unbroken dark area over the back and often a bald face.
5. A Medicino Hat is a paint horse, marked with a "bonnet" (spot) over the ears & poll, a "shield" on the throat, neck, chest, flanks, eyes, upper lip, and above the tail. The spots are always irregularly patterned and roaned. Colors include red, brown, black, blue, purplish, and tan. Hooves are vertically striped or black, the eyes are dark with a white sclera. A spot on just the ears and poll and nowhere else is also permissible.

SHOW RULES

1. Fee: per stable, - 75¢
2. One stamp per ounce or for every ten photos for return.
3. Class #17 is for horses that are neither Overo, Tobiano, or Medicino Hat. They are mostly for factory paints (Broyer & Hartland). Since these horses are not true pintos, the chances of a blue ribbon or a champ. at this show are slim.
4. Ribbons to 3rd, placings to fifth. Rosettes to Champions & Reserves.
5. Pleasure entries must have proper tack.
6. Costume entries must be in color.
7. DATE: AUGUST 29 & 30.

HOW TO SEND IN YOUR POINTS

Here it is! Finally, to clear the confusion, I will now explain how to send in your points, and how I tally them.

To make it easier, keep you points either 1) by horse or 2) by show. When listing them by horse, you must also include which show each placing is for. But, the recommended way is to list your points by show. Here is an example

1st Arabian Halter
1st Saddle Seat English Pleasure
Champion Halter

Okay, now how they are tallied. I have a sheet for each horse that has points. Each sheet is divided into 5 vertical columns. They are HALTER, ENGLISH, WESTERN, (STALLION, MARE, GELDING, FOALS), HARNESS. For example, on Joe King, he gets 10 points under the first column (Halter), 10 points under the 4th column (Western in his case, Gelding). Then he gets 5 points under the 3rd column (Western) and 5 more points under Geldings. You see the 4th column is a general column for all points. It gets no extra points because of approved shows (in most cases).

The question now must be "Then what does get extra points". Okay, in Joe King's case, if this were a C rated show, he would get 10 in Halter, 5 in Western, and 15 in Geldings. For having placed in a "C" show, he gets 5 extra points in Halter. If it were a "B" show, he would then total 10 in halter, plus 10 extra points, 5 in Western, plus 10 more in the Western column, and 15 total in the Geldings column. In an "A" show, the Halter column would get 10 plus 10 extra, Western would get 5 plus 5 extra, and Geldings would get 15, total.

I hope this will be helpful in the coming year.

NOTE: General Champs. count only for Stallions, etc. Specific chs., (Halter Ch, etc.) Count under Halter, etc., columns.

THE ONLY SHOWS TO BE ACCEPTED FOR POINTS WILL BE:

1. Approved by IMPHSA
2. Approved by PHMSA
3. Those which the owner voluntarily sends me a class list, not necessarily for approval, but sent to me AT LEAST one month in advance.
